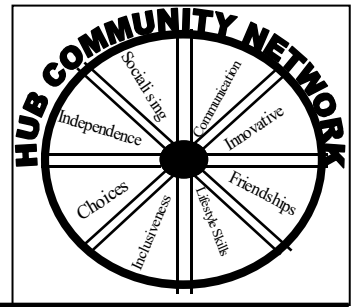
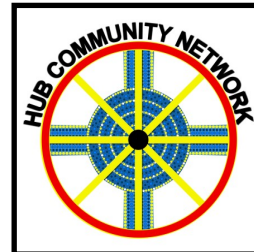

JOKE CORNER

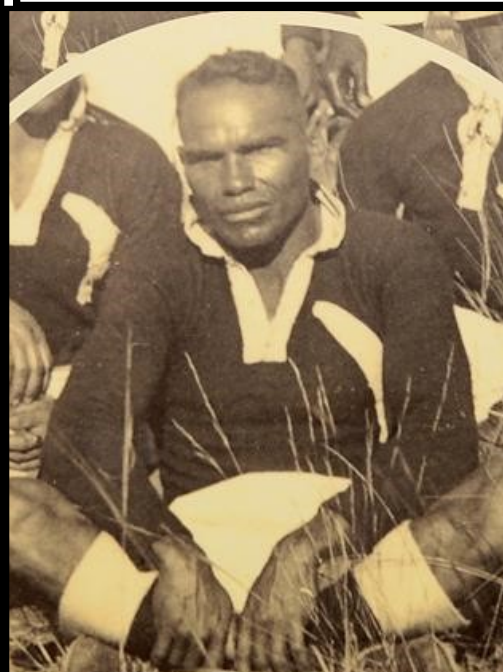
*I just burnt my Hawaiian pizza...

Frank "Big Shot" Fisher



When you cross the Barambah Creek upon entering Cherbourg you will cross the Frank "Big Shot" Fisher Bridge.

Frank Fisher was a champion local sportsperson at both rugby league and cricket. He was born in 1905 in Townsville and passed away in 1980.

Fisher played in local rep sides for many years including playing against the touring Great Britain sides in 1932 & 1936.

Fisher continued to play well into his early forties as captain of the Cherbourg side.

Many of his descendants live in Cherbourg to this day.

Editors note: I have spoken to old timers, who have now passed, that played with Frank Fisher and marvelled at his sporting abilities decades later.
