


A LIFETIME OF SERVICE


RECENT ACTIVITIES


THE AQUARIUM IS GETTING NEARER!

Latest NDIS Disability Report Findings, Oct—Dec 2022.

- More than 570,000 participants are receiving support from the NDIS, as of the 31st of December 2022.
- 20,477 new participants entered the scheme on the last quarter of the year, a 4% increase from the previous quarter.
- There has been a 7.4% increase in the proportion of First Nations NDIS participants in recent years.
- There were 2,153 participants aged under 65 years in residential aged care with an Ndis approved plan.
